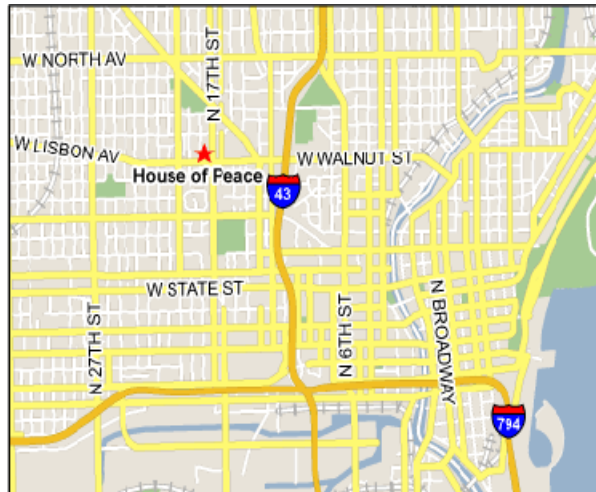

A Legal Information, Education & Referral Service for Nonprofits

M-LINC offers the following free services:

- ◆ Legal referral service,
- ◆ Educational programs, and
- ◆ Comprehensive clinical analysis of selected nonprofits

Legal Referral Service

M-LINC's Director and Marquette law students work with Wisconsin law firms and corporate in-house counsel to pair eligible nonprofits with volunteer attorneys for free advice on discrete legal issues. Nonprofits may contact M-LINC regarding their legal issue via M-LINC's warm line at (414) 288-6331 or toll free at (888) 530-5462. M-LINC also hosts a monthly walk-in clinic for nonprofit managers or directors who wish to discuss the nonprofit's legal issues in person.

The monthly clinic is held near Marquette's campus at The House of Peace Community Center, a Catholic Capuchin ministry that has been operating on the city's north-side since 1968. Volunteer attorneys and law students will be available at the monthly clinic to advise nonprofits on legal issues. The clinic will be held on the second Wednesday of every month from 3:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Educational Programs

M-LINC hosts educational programs for nonprofit managers and directors as well as continuing legal education programs for lawyers who serve nonprofits. These educational programs cover important legal issues for small and mid-sized nonprofits, including:

- ◆ Common Employment Law Issues, Including Suggested Personnel Policies
- ◆ Conflict of Interest, Whistleblower and Document Retention Policies
- ◆ Common Real Estate Law Issues
- ◆ Federal and State Reporting Requirements

Comprehensive Clinical Analysis of Chosen Nonprofit

M-LINC coordinates a clinical program each semester that capitalizes on the expertise of students and faculty at Marquette University's Law School, College of Business Administration, College of Professional Studies, and College of Communications.

Each clinical program provides a free, comprehensive, legal and strategic analysis for a selected Milwaukee nonprofit. Nonprofit organizations that have a specific issue requiring a multi-disciplinary and strategic analysis are eligible to apply for this service. If selected for participation, members of the nonprofit's staff and board of directors meet regularly with an interdisciplinary team of Marquette University faculty, students, and Milwaukee community advisors to address the legal, financial, governance, and public relations issues of the organization. The organization will receive a comprehensive planning report at the end of the clinical program.
